# **CHURCH? PART 5**

We have seen that the word church means a group of people called out to assembly together for a common purpose, that the word church could be used in two ways: to include all believers living and dead, and to speak only of those who are living in a certain location. Last month ae looked at a word that Jesus used in connection with Church and that was build, and we continue with that thought this month.

Jesus Himself declared to be the Rock on which the church is being built, He has to be the foundation, anything else will collapse or it will not be the building, the representation of God that happens when Jesus and not people, or an organisation are doing the building.

### **Matthew 16:13-18 (ANIV)**

When Jesus came to the region of Caesarea Philippi, he asked his disciples, "Who do people say the Son of Man is?"

They replied, "Some say John the Baptist; others say Elijah; and still others, Jeremiah or one of the prophets."

"But what about you?" he asked. "Who do you say I am?"

Simon Peter answered, "You are the Christ, the Son of the living God." Jesus replied, "Blessed are you, Simon son of Jonah, for this was not revealed to you by man, but by my Father in heaven.

And I tell you that you are Peter, and on this rock I will build my church, and the gates of Hades will not overcome it.

This is an important passage when considering the building, the people, who make up what is called church, some have confused Jesus saying you are Peter, and on this rock I will build my church, as meaning Peter is the rock on whom the church is built, but Jesus is word playing.

The word Peter means a stone, a pebble, a piece of rock, the Greek word is Petros.

# John 1:40-42 (NKJV)

"One of the two who heard John *speak*, and followed Him, was Andrew, Simon Peter's brother.

He first found his own brother Simon, and said to him, "We have found the Messiah" (which is translated, the Christ).

And he brought him to Jesus. Now when Jesus looked at him, He said, "You are Simon the son of Jonah. You shall be called Cephas" (which is translated, A Stone)."

When Jesus said upon this rock I will build my church He used the Greek word Petra which means a very large rock, see what Jesus did? By reminding Peter of his name a stone, a pebble which is a piece of rock, He then says His church will be build upon the Rock, which is Himself Jesus.

The church is not built upon Peter but upon Jesus.

This is what Peter says about the building of the Church.

### 1 Peter 2:4-8 (ANIV)

As you come to him, the living Stone—rejected by men but chosen by God and precious to him—

you also, like living stones, are being built into a spiritual house to be a holy priesthood, offering spiritual sacrifices acceptable to God through Jesus Christ.

For in Scripture it says: "See, I lay a stone in Zion, a chosen and precious cornerstone, and the one who trusts in him will never be put to shame."

Now to you who believe, this stone is precious. But to those who do not believe, "The stone the builders rejected has become the capstone,"

and, "A stone that causes men to stumble and a rock that makes them fall." They stumble because they disobey the message—which is also what they were destined for.

Peter confirms that Jesus is both foundation and cornerstone, he says come to Him, that is Jesus the living stone, that although He would be rejected in His lifetime, He is chosen, precious, and prophesied. Jesus can be trusted and to His followers, believers He is precious, although many will continually reject and refuse to follow Him. The messiah ( the rock ) that was rejected by the builders has become both foundation and cornerstone, and continues to cause people to stumble because they do not believe in Him or in His word and therefor are in disobedience.




### Church Continued

The official builders in His day rejected Jesus while on earth and people today still reject Him because they do not believe Him, so what is needed?

Just as Peter received a revelation from the Father to whom Jesus is so we also must receive a revelation, an understanding of whom Jesus is from the Father, this is not learnt or taught, this understanding, ability to believe comes from the Father, so ask the Father to reveal Jesus the Christ, the rock the builder of His church to you, and I am convinced He will.

Habakkuk part 4 ( John )

Please read Habakkuk 1:12-13

Habakkuk has asked his questions of how and why and now he reminds himself about what he knows about God, that God is eternal and holy.


This reveals that Habakkuk had a personal relationship with God, as he calls Him my God, my Holy one, my Lord. It was this personal relationship with God that saw Habakkuk through, that helped him come to terms with the revelation that God would use the Babylonians to judge Israel.



### Habakkuk continued

The circumstances we struggle with, justice and the goodness of God, the love of God, were the same for Habakkuk and like him it is our personal relationship with God that will help, see us through, and comfort us.

Imagine if we were told that God was going to judge the United Kingdom for their sins by using America, or Australia, this is how those in Habakkuk's day felt, and without a personal relationship with God would be left feeling alone, fearful, and that it wasn't fair or just, they needed to know as we need to know that God is Holy.






Habakkuk Continued

Notice that Habakkuk also reminds himself that God is the rock, (Jesus also refers to Himself as the rock upon which the church is built), this meant that God could be trusted, is the same yesterday, today and forever, He was his security, his refuge, his rock.

This personal understanding that his Lord is the rock, reliable, strong, unchanging meant that he could cast all his cares, worries upon Him, whatever we are going through we too need to know Him as the rock of our lives, to have Him as the foundation our lives are built upon, to cast our cares upon Him because He cares for us.

Jesus told a story of a wise and foolish builder, the foolish builder built his house upon sand, the wise builder built his house upon rock, when the storms came the one built on sand was destroyed, the meaning of this story is that the person who builds their life on Jesus by obedience to Him, will still be standing when the storms of life come.

So like Habakkuk we all need to know God as the Rock, because we all will have storms of life.





Habakkuk Continued

Habakkuk comes to realise that God can judge his people and use the Babylonians to do it, he almost charges God with not acting sooner, how could He see the disobedience and evil and do nothing.

Ever thought like that, Why doesn't God judge the evil that exists, why is He silent? If I was God I would not allow them to exist, they don't deserve to live. The problem is that God would have also to judge us and we all have sinned, so another aspect of a personal relationship with God that sees us through, even when evil seems to prosper and there's no justice is to know that God is merciful, graceful and is love towards people. Habakkuk struggled with what he saw around him and God not doing anything, its not clear if he resolved this but his relationship with God helped, and its our relationship with God that is the key to living our lives built upon the rock, knowing the holy, everlasting, unchanging God.


